

Manage Project Snapshots and Versions

Projects are auto-saved as you work. A project is always opened to its *current* version. Project snapshots capture a project definition at a point in time, and revert to a previous version if needed.

- [Take a New Snapshot of a Project](#) Taking a snapshot of a project is a good idea before doing exploratory work, or before working in a project created by another user. Because every change in a project is saved, snapshots are the only way to undo changes.
- [Restore a Project Snapshot](#) Restoring a project snapshot allows you to roll back the project to a previous version, then continue working from that point. AtScale always takes an auto-snapshot before restoring a snapshot.
- [Download the Project XML from a Snapshot](#) If you ever need the project XML file for a snapshot, you can download the file. You can simply download the file and restore the snapshot in order to obtain the file.
